Art, design, curiosities and a dash of the absurd awaits.


A RICH HISTORY

QT Wellington is a moving story, a success story... but at one stage, it nearly fell in the drink.

The hotel's rich history begins with an infamous tale of so-crazy-it-might-just-work innovation. The year 1993 saw the then 3000-tonne, fourstorey building take a 120-metre journey from where Te Papa Tongarewa now resides – 80 metres along and 40 metres across Cable Street. Audacious engineering saw the hotel riding a makeshift railway away from harbourside sinking ground and towards its new resting space. The daring feat was a true spectacle to say the least with thousands turning out to watch what was at the time, the largest ever building to be moved in New Zealand.

Nestled amongst Wellington's varied and vivacious offerings, QT Wellington is a staple to the city's ever-evolving art, culture and food scene. Led by design, quirk and innovation, QT Wellington celebrates its past as the Museum Art Hotel coupled with unique QT flair.




